Title: Has to be in figurative language → Creative, original (0- 1 – 2)

Good storyline/plotline (0- 1 – 2 – 3 - 4)

→ Original, school appropriate

Grammar, spelling, punctuation (0- 1 – 2 – 3 - 4)

Proper formatting (0- 1 – 2 – 3 - 4)

→(paragraphs, dialogue, new speaker new line)

→ 2 to 4 pages , 14 size font, Times New Roman (or similar size)

Illustrations: (0- 1 – 2 – 3 - 4 – 5 – 6 – 7 – 8 – 9- 10)

- Creative presentation → Border
- All Illustrations are original, including Title page (minimum 2-4)
- Cover & Table of Contents → Title, author, illustrations
